Well, hey y'all! If you can't tell, we are in the Southeast for meetings for most of this year. I was thinking it was about time to put out another newsletter and when I checked, I was surprised that I had not put one out since summer of last year!! I am sorry it has been so long. Time flies when one is as busy as we have been. A lot has happened since our last newsletter. We have had a wedding, two mission trips and, of course, a lot of meetings. But first, let me pass on some highlights of the meetings we have had so far this year.

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Jan. 3-8- Northside Baptist Church, Moncks Corner, SC.

We started the year near Charleston, SC in a church pastored by a former evangelist. They said that it was one of the coldest weeks they could remember there. However, the fellowship was warm, and we praise the Lord that there were souls that came to Christ during the meetings.

Jan. 10-14- Independent Bible Church, Greenville, SC.

This church may be small in size but has a big heart to serve the Lord. We had a great time encouraging the believers there. We also had the opportunity to spend some time with a Filipino pastor we had preached for on past mission trips to that country. He is presently here in the U.S. getting further training.

Jan. 15-Feb. 5- Brazil Mission Trip. God blessed greatly on the mission trip to Brazil. A full report follows later.

Feb. 7-13- Victory Baptist Church, Beaufort, SC.

This was our first time in this church. God truly blessed in these meetings outside of the Paris Island Marine Base. This is one of two places in the U.S. that is a boot camp for the Marines. We held nightly meetings in the church, and daily chapels in the Christian school. Multiple souls came to Christ in nearly every service. It snowed three inches on the last night but it did not stop God's blessing on the services.



Feb. 14-19 - Heritage Baptist Church, Ocala, FL. I preached for this pastor when he was leading a church in PA many years ago. Since then, he has gone into evangelism and now back into the pastorate. This was our first meeting with him since he has been in FL. God gave us a good week. The attendance was good and several came to know the Lord.

Feb. 22-27- Providence Bible Church, Crawfordville, FL.

This is a small church with a small A.C.E. school. We have always had fruitful meetings here, and this time was no exception. Between the daily school chapels and the evening services, there were many salvation decisions. Please pray for this ministry as the Pastor and his wife are getting older and are wanting to turn the church over to a younger pastor.



Feb. 28-Mar. 6 - Meadowlake Baptist Church, Mobile, AL.

This was our first meeting in this church. It was only about an hour away from where Mrs. Hal Webb grew up. We praise the Lord that souls came to Christ not only in the main services, but also in the children's meetings as well.

Mar. 7-12- Bible Baptist Church, Tuscaloosa, AL. It had been almost ten years since we had been to this church and it was good to be back again under a new pastor. Though there were few unsaved in these meetings, we praise the Lord for the souls that did make professions of faith in Christ here. It rained so much this week that the normally solid church yard became swampy. Our rig got stuck in the muddy yard and we had to get assistance from a church member with a four wheel drive truck to extricate ourselves. While we try not to get stuck in a rut in our ministry, this was not exactly the type of "lasting impression" we like to leave at a church.

Mar. 14-19- Central Baptist Church, Dothan, AL. This was our third straight week of ministry in AL. Again, there were not many unsaved in the meetings this week, but God blessed and there were many decisions made among believers, as well as a few folks who trusted Christ.



MISSION NEWS

Fiji 2009

Fiji is located about two thirds of the way from Hawaii to New Zealand, roughly 5,521 miles from Los Angeles, CA. It is made up of 322 islands. About 100 are inhabited. Tourism is Fiji's primary source

of income. The population is made up of island people and South Indians. There are many religions in Fiji, including Hindu, Muslim, Hare Krishna, and the cults.

On June 30, we boarded an Air Pacific flight to Fiji. We went there to have seventeen days of ministry with the Dakus. Paul and Martha Daku have been missionaries in Fiji for fifteen years. They are effective soul winners and church planters. The Dakus have four sons. Three of them are also missionaries in the South Pacific. The youngest, Josh, is fourteen, still at home, and very active with his parents in the ministry. We arrived early

Thursday morning. On Friday evening Cheryl and Rachel ministered to a meeting of ladies from two churches. Rachel presented a mini vocal concert, and Cheryl spoke. On Saturday, while Barry set up the equipment

at the church, Cheryl and Rachel participated in two children's Bible clubs. We began meetings at International Baptist Church in Lautoka on Sunday. Every night we held evangelistic meetings at the church. Each night the counseling rooms were full of folks coming to Christ. Each morning we were able to get into the public schools in town to share the gospel. There were many souls saved in these assemblies including some teachers and principals. This has opened the way for future school ministry! Each day, after the assemblies, we returned to the church so that Rachel could conduct a voice class for choir and church members, and Bible Institute students. She did a great job.

On Saturday, we traveled to the city of Sigatoka to work with Paul Daku Jr., and the ministries he leads. In addition to the Sunday services, we also held nightly meetings under a "shed" on the pastor's property. Multiple souls came to Christ every night in these meetings. Each morning, as in Lautoka, we did assemblies in the public schools. Again, there were many salvation professions. Also each day I taught classes on personal evangelism, puppetry, and music to the Bible Institute students.



We returned to Lautoka to preach for the anniversary Sunday of International Baptist Church. The building was filled for the festivities, and once again the Lord blessed with many saved. When we left Fiji on Wednesday night we completed what was probably the most fruitful mission trip we have ever made. Though we left the islands behind, we still carry the people in our hearts. I want to thank all of you who supported this trip with prayers and donations. You had a part in each soul that came to know the Lord.

Brazil 2010

On January 15, I left alone for Brazil. We had planned for Cheryl to go, but we needed to send her to New York to help my parents, since my mother had unexpected surgery just a few days before we were to leave. I spent the first Sunday to Wednesday with Graham Foran in Sao Paulo. The Lord blessed the meetings there with many decisions. Brother Foran commented that translating for me was like "drinking from a fire hose." From Thursday through Sunday morning, we worked with Pastor Roberto Coelho and his church in another part of Sao Paulo. We held evangelistic meetings in the church Friday and Saturday night. One night there were ten visitors. Nine of them trusted Christ. Counselors were leading folks to Christ in every corner of the building. We held VBS Friday, Saturday, and Sunday mornings. I have always been a soccer fan. Pastor Coelho informed me that the guest bed I was sleeping in at their house used to belong to Pele! For Sunday to Wednesday I was supposed to hold meetings for a national pastor in Jandira, but he was unable to get a translator. So I was shuttled out to the city of Sorocaba, about an hour and a half from Sao Paulo, to work with missionary Ben Jacobs. Sunday night I preached for New Life Baptist Church. For the next two days we did some inventive meetings. I presented the gospel at a cancer center Monday morning.

That afternoon I did an assembly at a school where we saw many salvation decisions. On Tuesday, we presented the gospel at a school for teaching English. We had 65 teen and college aged young people there. Over half the students there made professions of faith. So did a couple of the teachers. One of them came to church the following Sunday. From Wednesday through Friday, I worked with missionary Mike Jewell doing three days of camp for 21 Bible club kids. They really enjoyed the chalk art and puppets. Though most of these children were supposed to be saved, there were three who made



professions of faith. For Saturday and Sunday, I went back to work with Ben Jacobs and the Hope Baptist Church. On Saturday I did three seminars for Sunday school teachers and children's church workers on puppetry, evangelizing youth, and using visual aids in teaching. That evening I spoke to a teen meeting and a men's meeting. On Sunday, I preached for the Sunday services of the church. I returned to the suburbs of Sao Paulo for my last few days and stayed with Missionary Jeff Thibaudeau. He translated for me as I preached one night meetings at his church in Vargem Grande and one other in Baueri. Both churches were filled. Both pastors said they wished they had scheduled longer meetings and would do so the next time. On Thursday, I left Brazil praising the Lord for the many souls that had come to Christ and for the believers that had been strengthened. Again, I appreciate all who gave for this mission trip.

Upcoming Trips Kenya 2010

From May 10-25 I will be heading to Kenya to preach two weeks of evangelistic meetings and pastor's conferences for national pastors there. Pastor Thomas Michael from New England Baptist Church in Medford, MA will accompany me. He will be a great help with the pastor's conferences. Please pray that the Lord will bless the trip with many souls.

2011 Moldova Construction Team

Calling all workers! We are again forming a team of laborers to go to Moldova to do construction work for the Bible Institute there. In May of 2009 we took a team of 29 volunteers from 14 different churches and 8 states to prepare buildings at the Camp Hope property to begin a Bible Institute there that September. It was a blessed and fruitful trip. There are 21 students training in the Institute now. This time we plan to work on at least two projects. We will be building apartments for married students and students with families who want to attend the institute. It will also house some married faculty as well. We need masons, electricians, carpenters, roofers, plumbers, painters, flooring specialists, cooks, and other experienced building experts to participate in this trip. Men are welcome to take their wives. We can put everyone to work, including those who are not experts in construction, but are available to go and would like to help. 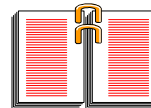
HEALTH UPDATES



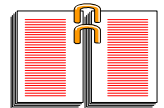
