Howdy from the West coast!

Every few years we come to the West coast for meetings. We work our way across the southern states, arriving in California in February. We stay until the middle of the summer, and then head north into British Columbia. In mid September, we begin to work our

way east across the northern states. At present we are in the Bay Area of California conducting a week of Vacation Bible School. This year has been our most fruitful year of ministry in California. We have some good reports to share of our meetings in the U.S. and overseas.

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Jan. 4-7- Stanley Heights Baptist Church, East Ridge, TN.

We had some vehicle issues on our way to our first meeting. We had to have all the gaskets and seals around the high pressure oil pump in the truck replaced in New York over New Years. That was about \$400. We drove to South Carolina, picked up our trailer, and went on to Tennessee, and the truck was leaking oil again. We had to pay an additional \$1,300 to have the whole high pressure oil pump assembly replaced. We praise God for His provision. The church gave us a \$3,500 love offering that took care of the expenses of this repair. Although the church was busy moving to a new building, the attendance was good and we saw souls saved.



Jan. 11-16- Grace Bible Baptist Church, Corinth, MS.

This was our third meeting in this church. The Lord gave us a great meeting with several folks saved. I enjoyed playing horn numbers with the pastor's son during the week. This church also gave \$500 for the building supplies for the Moldova Bible college construction project.

Jan. 18-21- Faith Baptist Church, Okmulgee, OK. This started out as a Sunday to Wednesday meeting and was

extended through Friday. Cheryl's uncle pastors this church in America's heartland. There were lots of visitors throughout the week, and multiple professions of faith. There were souls saved nearly every service.

Jan. 25-28- Tabernacle Baptist Church, Killeen, TX. This church is outside Fort Hood, the largest Army base in the country. The Pastor picked up a cancellation week. Though

the church was small, and was going through some financial problems, we still saw several souls saved. We were also able to help a military couple that was having marital problems. Praise the Lord! He not only builds homes, but he is also in the repair and restoration business!



Jan. 25-30 - Regeneration Reservation, Ft. Thomas, AZ.

We spent the next week visiting Bethany and Philip in Arizona. They are happy in their ministry as missionaries to American Indians. Regeneration Reservation ministers to the San Carlos and White River Indian reservations in eastern AZ. We had the opportunity to participate in the normal weekly ministries there.

Feb. 8-13- Fundamental Baptist Church, Escondido, CA.

This was our first meeting in California for the year. In addition to the regular meetings, we also had the opportunity to minister to two Good News Clubs at two area public schools. We praise the Lord for all the souls that were saved in the meetings and clubs.

Sunday, Feb. 15- Calvary Baptist Church, Temecula, CA.

We attend this church whenever we visit Cheryl's sister. The pastor was getting over the flu and was still having trouble with his voice. He asked me to preach for him that morning. Not only were several souls saved, but the church sent one of its members on the construction team to Moldova in May.

Feb. 22-25- Central Baptist Church, Pamona, CA. There were lots of visitors at this meeting. Many of them came to the Lord. In addition to the services in the church, I also preached in chapel for the Pacific Baptist College.

Mar. 1-6- Victory Baptist Church, Atwater, CA. Atwater is a regular stop for us half way between southern and northern CA. This was another blessed week with great attendance and a bunch of souls saved.

Mar. 8-11- Liberty Baptist Church, Manteca, CA. The meetings were an encouragement to the folks at this small struggling church. We saw visitors attend and a number of souls saved, including several from the same family.

Mar. 15-20- Stockton Baptist Church, Stockton, CA.



Pastor Steve Kilthau was one of the first pastors in CA to have us for meetings. He has had us come every time we have been in CA. We praise God for their beautiful new church building. The Lord moved wonderfully. There were many visitors and many decisions for Christ, both in the church and school.

Mar. 22-27- Heritage Baptist Church, Antioch, CA. We have been coming to Heritage since the beginnings of our western trips. A number of souls were saved in both the evening services and the daily school chapels.

Mar. 29-Apr. 3- First Baptist Church, Pinole, CA. God blessed this meeting with souls saved nearly every service. One man invited a neighbor man to go to supper with him. He told him he had to stop by the church to drop something off. (*which he did*) When they got to the church, he invited the neighbor in to the services, and the man was saved that night. They went on to supper afterward.

Apr. 5-8- Manor Baptist Church, San Leandro, CA. Something seemed to be hindering the meetings this week. Despite this, we still saw souls come to Christ. The meeting ended Wednesday, but the pastor requested a special Friday night service on the subject of revival.

Apr. 12-15- Foothill Baptist Church, Castro Valley, CA. A Romanian congregation has merged with this church. On Easter Sunday, I preached with the Romanian pastor translating. There were no unsaved in these meetings, but the Lord worked in the hearts of the believers. A young man from this church joined our Moldova work team.

Apr. 19-May 1- Cornerstone Baptist Church, Pleasant Hill, CA. We spent two weeks with this church. The first was a regular church meeting. The second involved two house meetings in church member's homes. The Lord blessed both weeks with several souls saved. A man from this church was the last to join the Moldova construction team.

May 3-8- Berean Baptist Church, Fairfield, CA. This church has a ministry to recovering drug addicts and alcoholics. The church is growing. We had a good meeting with several salvation decisions by the end of the week.

May 11- 22- Mission Trip To Moldova. (*Report later*)

May 24-29- Iglesia Biblica Bautista Antioquia, Antioch, CA. This was our third meeting at this Spanish speaking church. Every meeting we have had here has been blessed of God. The attendance was terrific and there were souls saved every service. Pastor Rick Armstrong and his son took turns translating the messages each evening.

June 7-12- Calvary Baptist Church, Porterville, CA. This was our first summer meeting and the first time the church had ever had a Family VBS. Folks came faithfully each night and brought visitors. As a result, a number of folks were saved. We had a trailer tire blow out on our way here. I had a spare, and was able to change the tire. When I checked that week, I found that a replacement tire would cost around \$300. Praise the Lord! The church purchased the tire for us.

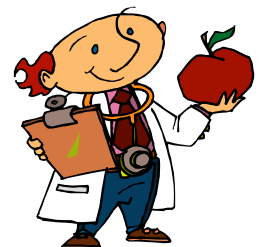

MISSION NEWS

2009 Moldova Work Team

The Lord brought together a team of 29 volunteers from 8 states and 14 churches from Massachusetts to California. From May 11-22, the team flew to Moldova to prepare buildings for the start of a Bible college this Fall. The team worked 12-14 hours a day for eight days and accomplished a massive amount of work.

We had at least four projects going on simultaneously. One crew made furniture for the student dormitory. They built: two ladders, drop ceiling frame, 32 bunk beds, 20 desks, 20 wardrobes, and 14 bookcases. To put this huge task into perspective, consider that Moldovan wood is green and rough. Once delivered, it was planed, sanded, cut to size, and assembled.



Another crew glued Styrofoam insulation to the dormitory exterior and added two layers of netting and stucco. They completed their task in record time, and then assembled and transported furniture to the dorm rooms.

Several team members worked in the administration building tearing up old flooring, installing carpet, and painting the second and third floor rooms.

A fourth crew worked on the empty third floor of another building creating the college educational area. They insulated the ceiling, repaired and stuccoed the interior walls, put down a new layer of concrete, and built an auditorium, two classrooms, and a library. They insulated and dry walled the rooms, and ran wiring for and installed outlets, lights, switches, and a new circuit panel. In addition, they installed drop ceiling in the classrooms, and carpet in all rooms but one. They also painted the ceiling and one classroom, and installed cable and networking equipment.

There were six ladies on the team. They helped with various projects, cooked three meals a day, prepared and served snacks twice a day between meals, and collected, washed, and redistributed all the laundry for the entire team.

On Sunday the team divided to minister in five different Moldovan churches. Team members gave testimonies,

played instruments, sang and preached. Several folks trusted Christ as a result of these ministries.

Dr. Chapman said we accomplished in eight days what might normally take two years there. I want to thank all of you who supported this project with prayer or funds. The Lord supplied over \$25,000 for the work! God bless you!

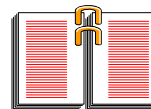

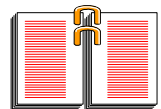
