MISSION NEWS

2011 Moldova Construction Team



I want to thank every church and individual that had a part in making the 2011 Moldova Construction Project possible. In 2009 I had the privilege to lead a team of 29 volunteers to Moldova for two weeks in May to prepare buildings for the beginning of the EurAsian Baptist Bible Institute in Vatica. We raised \$27,000 for building supplies. Those funds were in, and most of the airline tickets were purchased by the end of January. One of the things that the Lord taught me this year is that He does not always do things the same way twice. I am a detail man, a goal oriented person, a planner. I like to have things in place with as few surprises as possible. The run up to this trip was altogether different. This project was for four weeks, and we would need two teams instead of one. We planned to transform a dilapidated old camp staff building into an apartment building for married students and staff at the Bible institute. We needed to raise \$25,000 for supplies. Though we had lined up many of the team members, by the middle of April we only had \$2,000 toward the building supplies. We continued to pray, while reluctantly considering postponing the trip for another year. It was mid April and the first team was going to need to leave in mid May.

Things changed rapidly. I was contacted by a Pastor in WV who said his church would like to help with the project. They sent a check for \$15,000. More money came in until, by the time the team left, we had the funds necessary to do the job. Other things also happened in whirl wind fashion. Though we had a lot of willing workers signed up, we were still short some of the professionals we needed. We needed plumbers for both phases, and an electrician for the first phase. The Lord provided the plumbers four weeks before the trip from churches in MA and SC. Only two and a half weeks before departure, a pastor from VA e-mailed that his church was paying for an electrician and his wife from their church to go.

On Friday, May 6th, our project manager, and two other men from a church in PA left for Moldova. This "scout" team had two goals. The first was to make sure that the supplies would be on site when the work team arrived. The other was to try to get an old Russian-built crane on the property run-

Apr. 10-15 - Calvary Bible Church, Westport, MA. Several came to know the Lord in our third meeting at this coastal Massachusetts church. The folks here helped one of their men, a plumber, to go to Moldova with our mission construction team. We were very thankful to have him.

Apr. 17-22 - Northside Baptist Church, Windham ME. This church was proud to be in their new building after renting a store front for years. Though the church is small, God blessed with good attendance during the week. The meetings resulted in the first visitors to the new location, and the first souls saved in the new building.

Apr. 24-29 - New Hope Baptist Church, Farmington, ME. The meeting began with an Easter sunrise service on a hill near the church. The weather was beautiful for the service. The following week of meetings produced good Christian decisions and souls coming to Christ. Several men from this church, including the pastor, went to Moldova with us.

May 1-6 - Second Baptist Church, Lebanon, ME. We had never been to this church before. The meetings went well, and several were saved. We appreciated this church allowing us to leave our trailer there while I was in Moldova.

June 5-10 - Lewisburg Bible Church, Lewisburg, PA. Pastor Wenger is an old friend of the Hal Webb Team. It was a blessing to preach for his church. There were few unsaved in the meetings, but one soul did come to Christ.

June 12-17 - Calvary Baptist Church, Bedford, VA. It had been eight years since we were at this church. It was good to be back again. The folks came faithfully, and there were several saved throughout the week.

June 19-24 - Bethel Baptist Church, Hampton, VA. We held our first VBS for the summer at this church. There were over 160 children in attendance and it was a blessing to see some of them make professions of faith in the Lord Jesus.

June 27-July 1 - Rapidan Baptist Camp, Rochelle, VA.



Our first week of camp for the summer yielded many decisions including some for salvation, separation from worldliness, and

surrender to the will and work of the Lord.

July 3-8 - Victory Baptist Church, Brodheadsville, PA. This small congregation was faithful in attendance. We spent most of this week preaching to encourage the believers since the church had been through some recent difficulties. One visitor also came to the Lord.

July 10-16- Valleyview Baptist Church, Northampton, PA. We not only saw a number of children saved in the daily VBS, but there were also several parents of children who trusted Christ in the closing program Friday night.

ning so that we could use it. It had been declared "dead" by the Moldovan staff. We were setting out to repair a derelict crane, and rescue a deteriorating building.

On Monday, May 9th, the first team met at Dulles airport near Washington D.C. They came from ME, MA, GA, PA, and VA. Everything was going well until I found out, as we were boarding our aircraft, that our electrician and his wife were not assigned seats. The flight was overbooked. The airline put them up in a hotel overnight, and they arrived in Moldova a day later than we did. No luggage was lost. The team arrived in Moldova on Tuesday evening, May 10th, and the work began on Wednesday. We had a lot of demolition to do to the building before we could begin construction. The team worked hard from 7:30 AM to 6:00 PM daily. In just a few days, the crane was not only running, but being used at the work site! During the first two weeks, the team poured the footers for the new walls, built the new rear wall and most of the new front one, roughed in the drainage lines and most of the electrical work, constructed all of the trusses and rafters, and got the back half of the roof completed. The first team left Moldova on Saturday, May 21st.

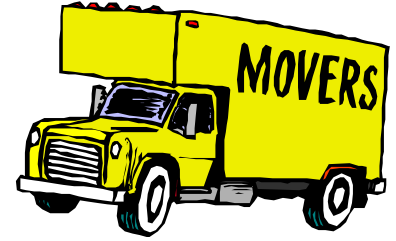


On Monday, May 23rd the members of the second phase team left their homes in North and South Carolina. They met in Atlanta, and continued on to Moldova. Everyone made the flights. One suitcase was lost but was delivered a day later. The construction continued for the next two weeks. The second phase team made good progress. While they were there, they

were able to finish the new front wall, pour the concrete for the sub floors, install the new main power panel and sub panels, finish the front half of the roof and paint all of the rafters and trusses with fire retardant. They also ran the fresh water plumbing, put stucco on the outside of the new walls, installed the framework and drywall ceiling in the front and rear additions, sheathed the gable ends of the building, built the partition walls for the new bathrooms and installed the plumbing and wiring in those walls. By the time they had had to leave, the building had come a long way. There is still a lot of work to be done on the building, but the Bible Institute students will work to complete that with their construction classes when they return in the Fall. Nearly all of their work will be interior finish work. Lord willing, the building will be completely finished before next year. Our construction teams would have loved to have finished the building, but we are satisfied in knowing that we got that lion's share of the work done while we were there. To God be the glory!

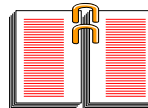
WEBBS MOVE

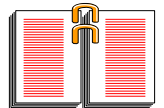
